LAUDATO SI WEEK 2025

RAISING HOPE

To honour the 10th Anniversary of the Laudato Si Encyclical the Parish Council and LS Circle by the Ocean Group have decided to hold a public screening of *The Letter: A Message for our Earth o*n Friday 30 May, from 5:00pm to 7:30pm in the Parish Meeting Room. Pizza provided!

Ten years ago today, 24 May, Pope Francis wrote a letter to all peoples entitled 'Laudato Si': on Care for our Common Home'. We celebrate with mixed emotions, sadness for his passing, gratitude for his legacy in the example of his life and teaching, and joy as we welcome the election of his successor Pope Leo XIV.

In his Letter Francis made an urgent appeal to the whole human family to come together to protect our common home and to seek a sustainable future. In his concluding words he prayed

The poor and the earth are crying out.

O Lord, seize us with your power and light,
help us to protect all life,
to prepare for a better future,
for the coming of your Kingdom
of justice, peace, love and beauty.

Praise be to you! Amen.

(Given in Rome at Saint Peter's on 24 May, the Solemnity of Pentecost, in the year 2015, the third of my Pontificate. Franciscus)

The film was made in 2022. It features Pope Francis and documents projects in various regions of the world which were inspired by Laudato Si – from the Amazon, India, Senegal and Hawai'i - then follows project 'champions' to the Vatican where they meet with Pope Francis. Francis shares his vision in beautifully human interactions. Together they are revitalized in hope for their projects and the future of planet Earth.

A recent Vatican Press highlighted important aspects of the document. These included:

1. International Significance – its influence in building the consensus for the Paris Agreement 2015 whereby 196 nations signed a Treaty to limit global warming to 1.5 C. It is recognized for its 'moral voice'. Australian economist, Ross Garnaut, described it as the 'most rigorous, comprehensive and influential treatment of the ethics of climate change' and 'grounded in sound and

contemporary knowledge of atmospheric physics'.

2. The Poetic and Mystical Quality of Francis' thought – 'The universe unfolds in God, who fills it completely. Hence, there is mystical meaning to be found in a leaf, in a mountain trail, in a dewdrop, in a poor person's face. Standing awestruck before a mountain, we cannot separate this experience from God'. (LS233). This is an example of creation theology which informs Ecological Spirituality, and which is expressed throughout Francis' writings and in the liturgy of the Season of Creation.

3. Integral Ecology – Francis is sensitive to the interconnectedness and interdependence of all beings. His central and novel insight is that the climate crisis and contemporary social, political and economic crises are intimately linked – the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. Hence the idea of Integral Development and the linking of the LS Goals for Promoting Integral Human Development with the United Nations Goals for Sustainable Development.

FIRST READING

Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2. 22-29

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to burden you beyond what is essential.

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

SECOND READING

Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

He showed me the holy city coming down out of heaven.

In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel of crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.
