# **PROJECT COMPASSION REFLECTION**

The word 'heart' occurs almost a thousand times in the Bible, more than three times as often as the word 'soul.' Perhaps this is just another item of trivia but surely it gives us a clue about Christianity. It is a religion of the heart. It gets our blood pumping.

As we approach the climax of our Lenten journey, this week's readings ask questions about our hearts. The psalm begs 'a pure heart create for me, O God.' Those words invite the Lord to come right inside us, into the very core of our being. The prophet Jeremiah quotes the Lord as saying, 'deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts.' In other words, we won't find God's most intimate whisperings to us just in books or lectures. We will find it when we are genuinely in touch with our core, our most intimate space. God's love is inscribed on our hearts.

In his letter *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis speaks against 'a culture of walls.' He

asks us to treasure the hope found in every heart:

Hope 'speaks to us of something deeply rooted in every human heart, independently of our circumstances and historical conditioning. Hope speaks to us of a thirst, an aspiration, a longing for a life of fulfillment, a desire to achieve great things, things that fill our heart and lift our spirit to lofty realities like truth, goodness and beauty, justice and love... Hope is bold.'



The word 'caritas' means love. The work of Caritas Australia is a heartfelt response to the needs of the world, one that gives expression to our shared hope. Caritas always works in partnership with others. During Lent, as we have listened to the experience of people we have helped through our support of Project Compassion, we will have noticed that life-giving partnerships with groups on the ground in many countries make this possible.

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the grain of wheat that must die to create a rich harvest. Of course, he is referring to his own passion. But there is a message here for us all. 'Anyone who loves their life will lose it.' We are called to wear our hearts on our sleeves. To be led by love for others.

You are invited to join with us for our next meeting to be held at 4:30 -5:15pm on Thursday, 21 March in the Parish Meeting Room. Pope Francis reminds us that young generations have a right to receive a beautiful and habitable world from us. This invests us with grave responsibilities towards creation which we received from God's generous hands. In response to extreme weather events and catastrophes throughout 2023 he wrote the Apostolic Exhortation Laudate Deum, an update to his Encyclical Laudato Si. These catastrophic events continue globally and in Australia in 2024. We will reflect, pray and seek ways to actively respond to *Laudate Deum* and Francis' plea to accompany him "on a **pilgrimage of reconciliation with the world that is our home** and to help make it more beautiful, because that commitment has to do with our personal dignity and highest values" (LD69).

# PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL REPORT

Over the past six months the work of the PPC has been guided by four key documents:

• The *Parish Pastoral Plan* which aims to provide welcome and support for parishioners and parish groups, to continue preparations for our parish 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary and to prayerfully discern our approach to Bishop Brian's invitation to embark on a journey of parish renewal through the resources provided by the Diocese.

• Ongoing updating of the *Parish Ministry Manual.* 

• Preparing and uploading to the website our practical Parish response to *Laudato Si.* 

• Examining aspects of the *Handbook for Parish Councils* at each meeting and seeking a deepening understanding of the role of the PPC and ways of ensuring parishioners can express their views, hopes and feedback.

The Council meets on the second Tuesday of each month, 7:00 – 9:00pm, in the Parish Meeting Room in Kiama. There is a set agenda and supportive, respectful discussions, with a deep understanding that membership should be life-giving rather than burdensome.

# FIRST READING

Jeremiah 31:31-34 The days are coming when I will make a new covenant with

Israel and I will forgive their iniquity.

See, the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks – when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt.
